Recently I visited the Intacs corneal implant website to learn more about my options for Keratoconus. I learned that Intacs corneal implants were FDA approved back in August, 2004 to treat keratoconus. I understand that patients who may be contact lens intolerant and who have difficulty functioning on a day to day basis may be best considered for Intacs as their primary option to stabilize the cornea and potentially defer a corneal transplant.
